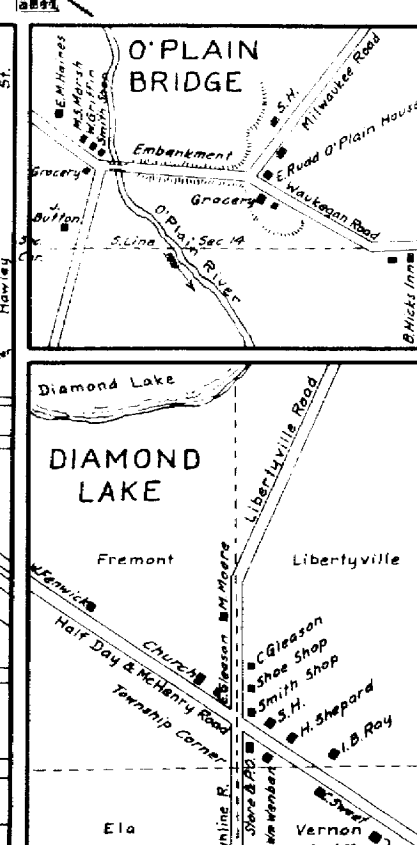
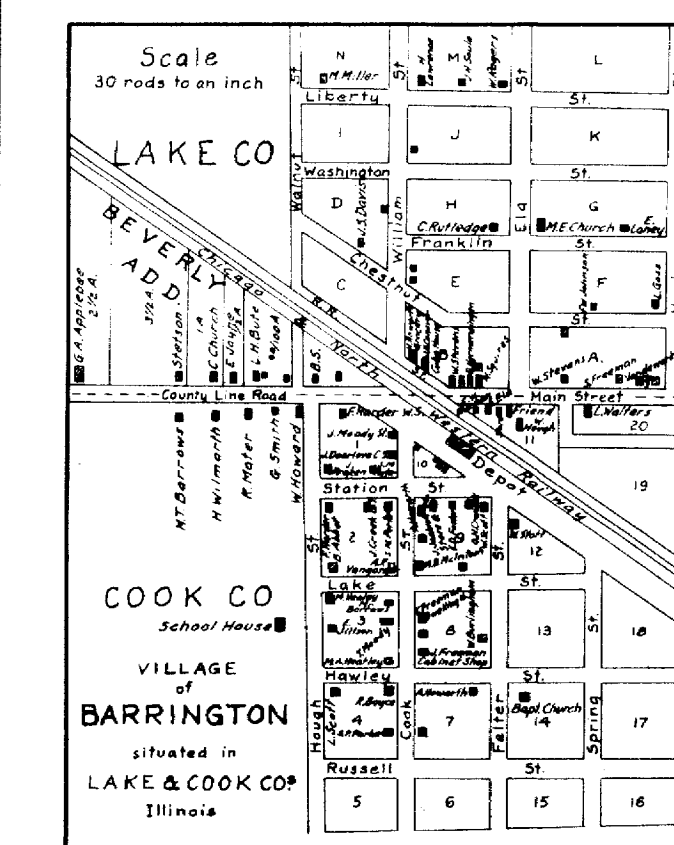
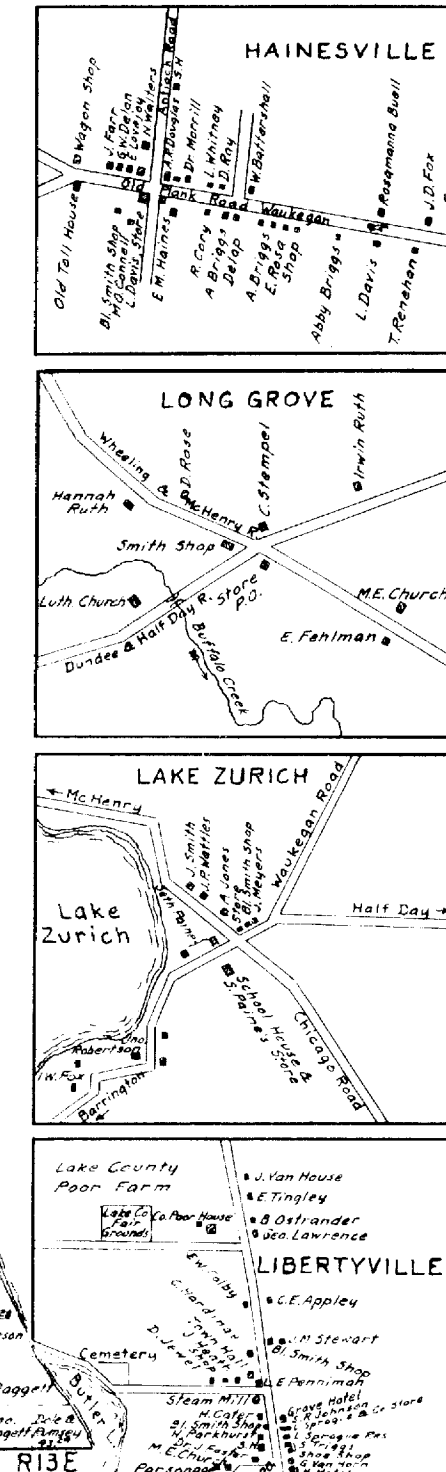
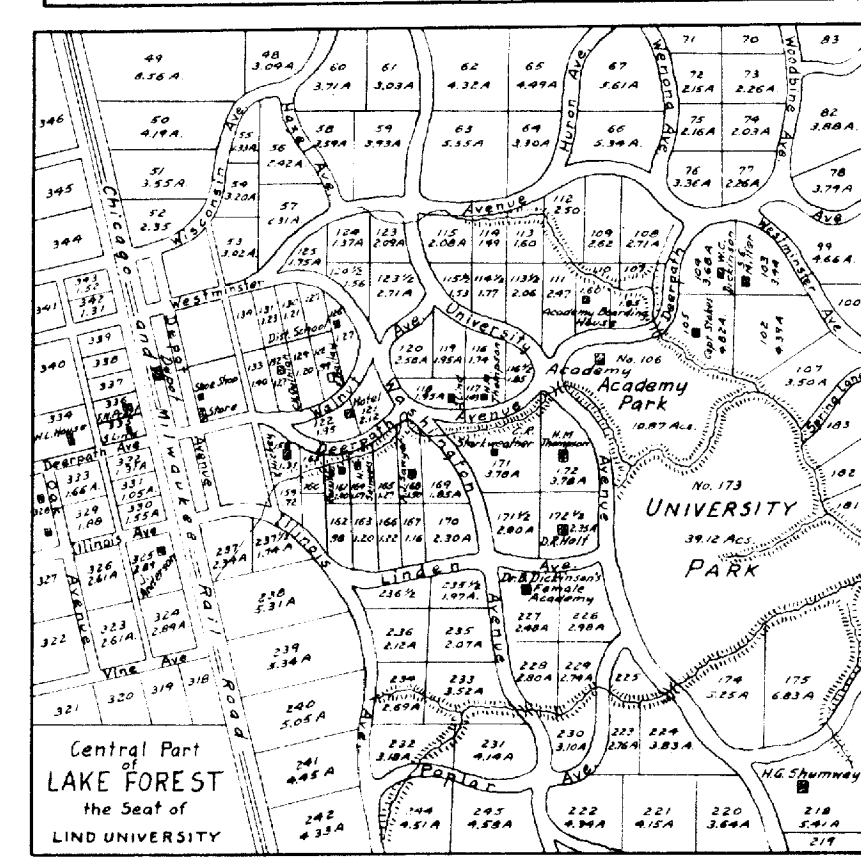
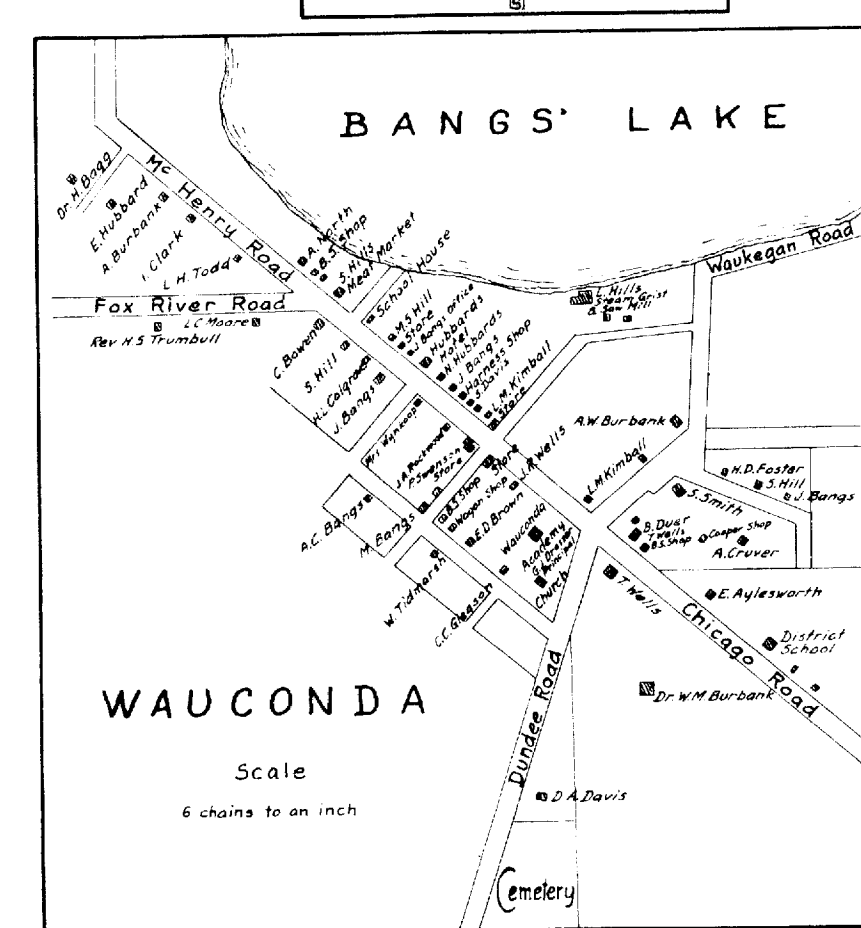
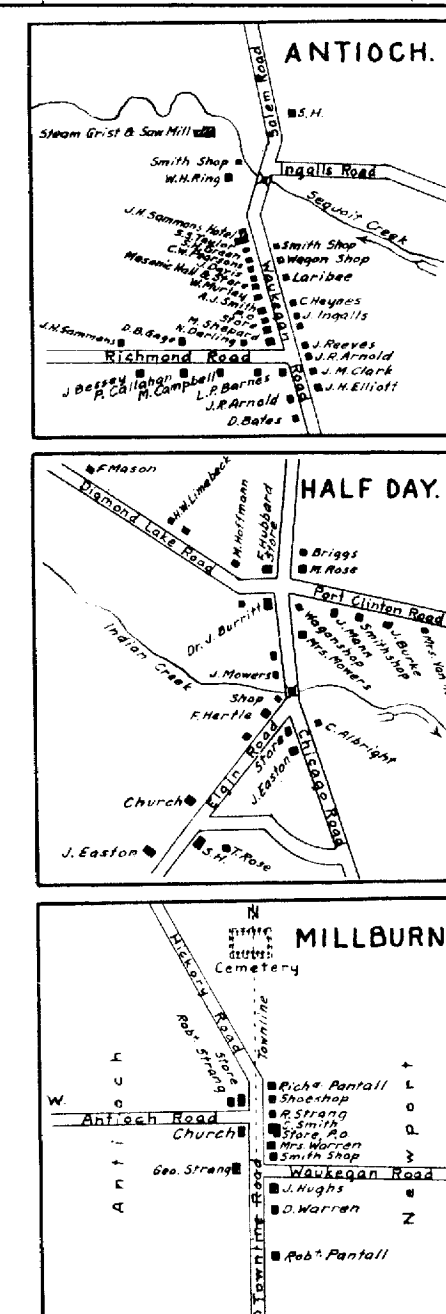
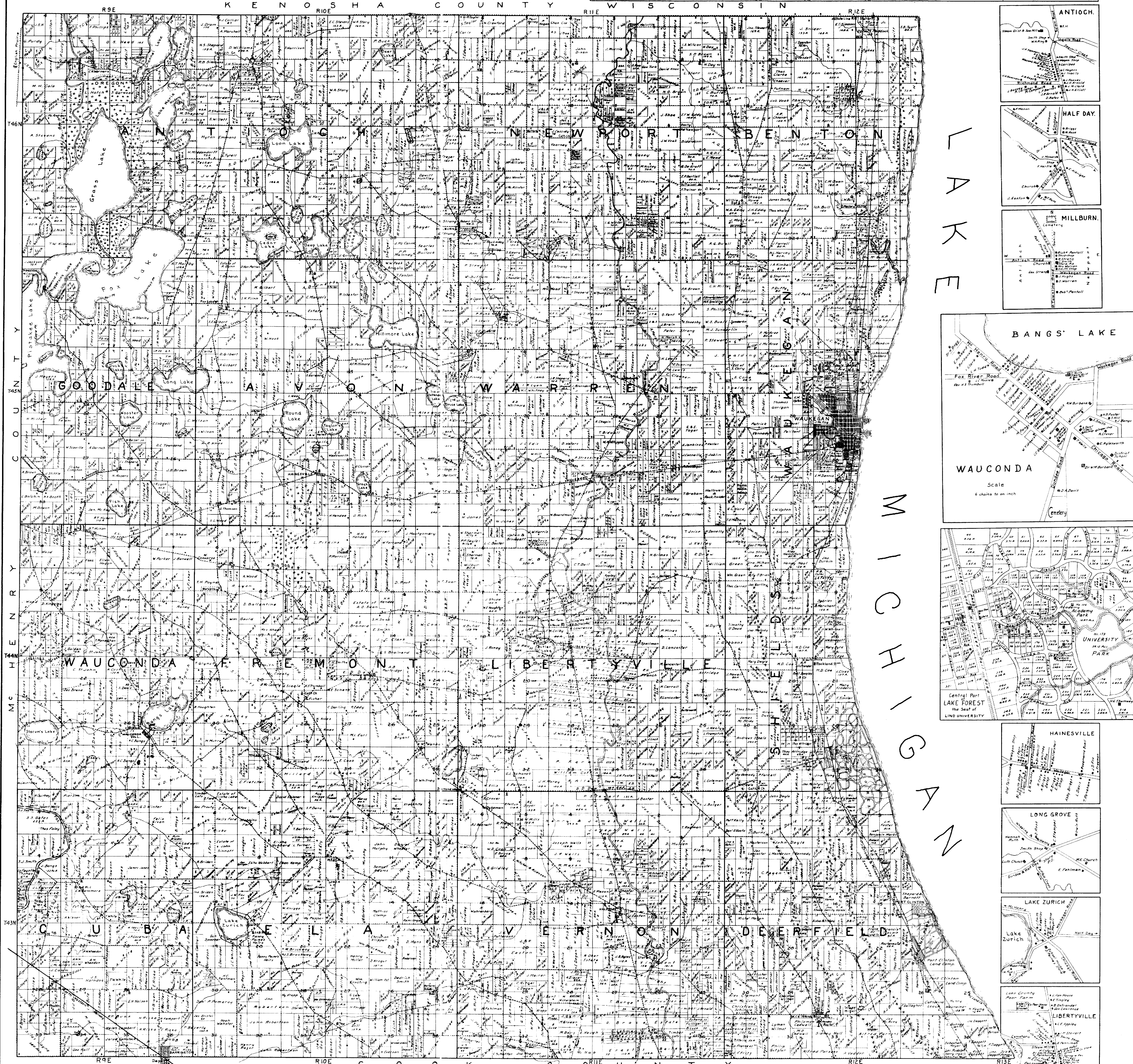
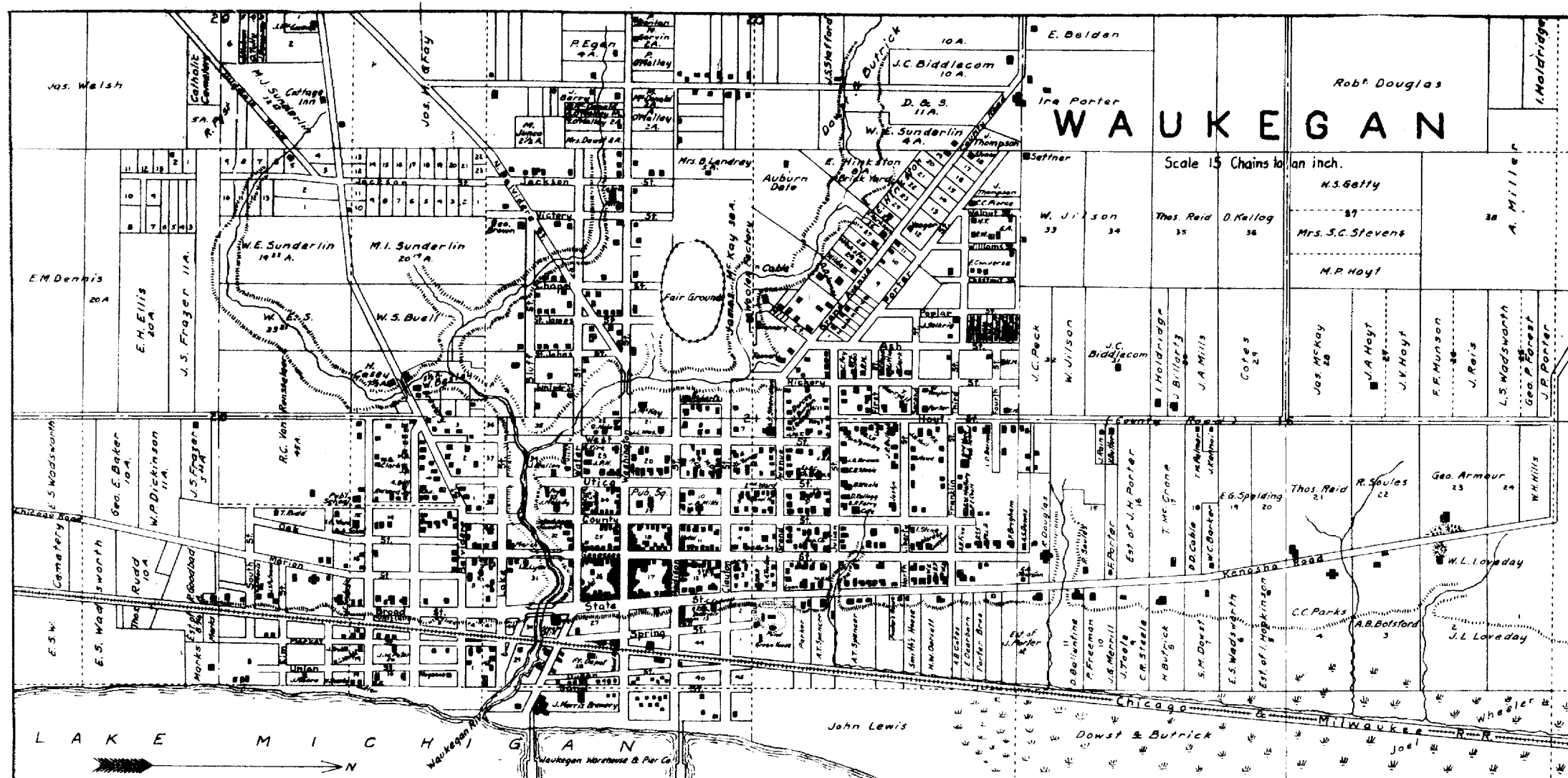


# MAP OF Lake County ILLINOIS

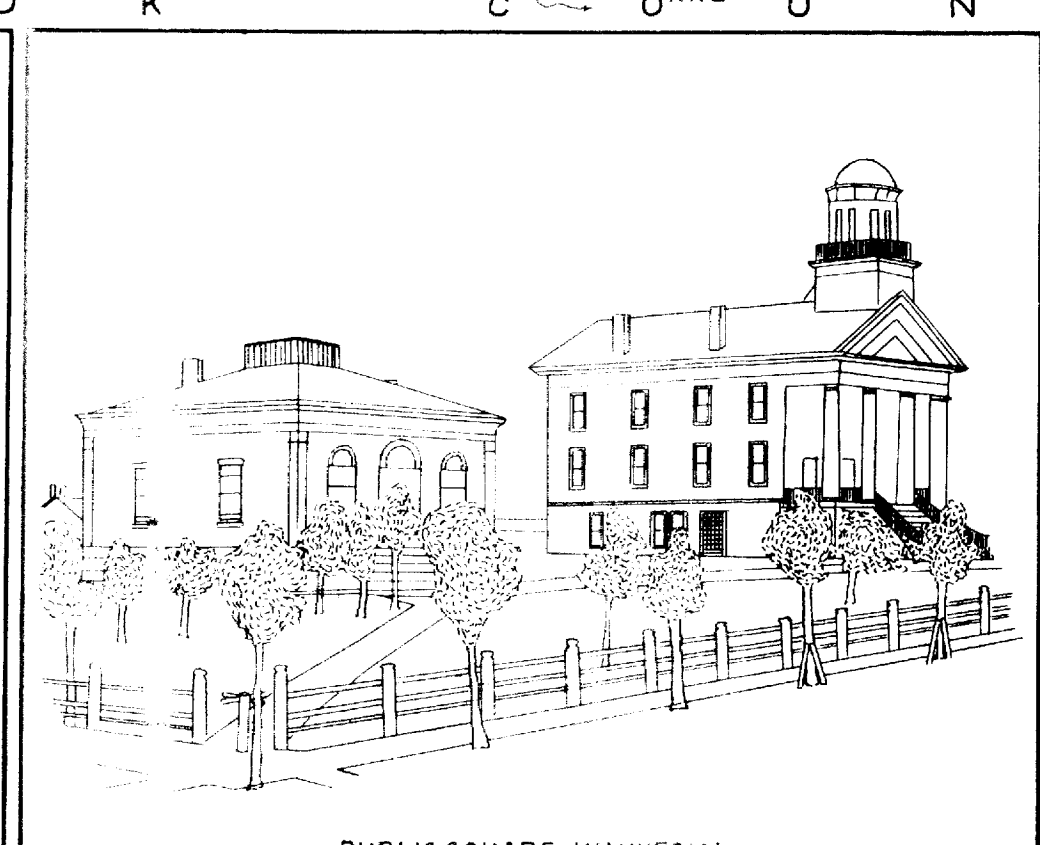

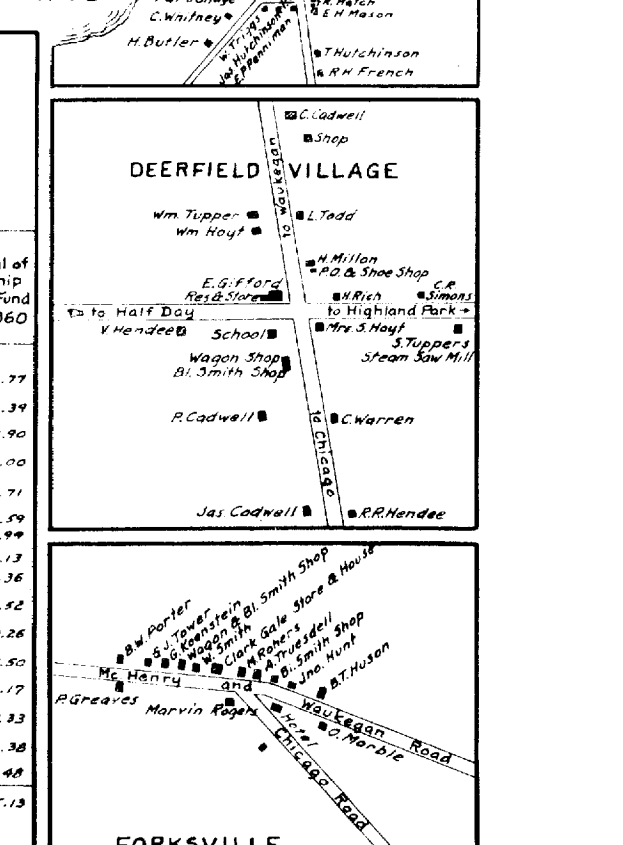
